Kuwait first in organ donation after death in **Arab world**



Kuwait comes first in the Arab region and second in middle east in terms of number of organ donors after death. As per the Kuwait organ transplant society 50 deceased renal transplants and 49 live donor transplants has been successfully completed last year. So around 100 renal transplants are carried out annually. However, shortage of donated organs is a global crisis. The list of waiting patients is growing whereas the number of available organs remains small. The United Network of Organ Sharing (UNOS) shows hundreds and thousands of patients who are waiting for different types of organs and some of them die during waiting. Both living and deceased donors occupy an essential parts of organ transplant. Live donor transplant is done from relatives and non-relatives. Since the number of expats are more in Kuwait, the donors are non-Kuwaitis compared to Kuwaitis. The ministry supports the donor's family.

Since Kidney failure is commonest type of organ failure there is significant demand to kidneys compared to other organs. Kidney transplants constitute the largest number of transplants annually in Kuwait and globally.

Evidence based breast feeding benefits by age.



Day One: Newborn milk or colostrum is a laxative that helps remove sticky meconium. Colostrum coats and protects baby's sensitive gut.

Month One: Oxytocin release from caring improve the mother child bonding. It also helps in contracting mother's uterus back to original size.

Month Four: Breastfeeding significantly lowers baby's risk of SIDS. In addition, long term risk of asthma is lowered. It also decreases mother's risk of postpartum depression.

Month Six: Breast feeding helps in gut maturation of the baby so that baby can be ready for solids. Six months of breast feeding reduces mother's risk of type 2 Diabetes Mellitus and breast cancer.

Month Nine: Increases baby's immunity and tolerance to solid foods.

Month Twelve: Breastfeeding past a year reduces baby's lifelong risk of heart disease, several cancers, high blood pressure and other chronic diseases.

Month Eighteen: Continued breastfeeding will improve the immunity and baby's resistance against microorganisms. It also provides hydration and nutritional insurance.





